# **DC D-CFAR Highlights**



- Multi-institutional CFAR in Year 4 2010-2015
- Currently 180+ investigators
- 38 new NIH HIV/AIDS awards since DC D-CFAR established
- **36** newly hired faculty in HIV/AIDS at member institutions
- □ 21 DC D-CFAR pilot research awards for \$659K
- 10 administrative supplements for \$4.7M
- Coordinate CFAR/APC HIV Continuum of Care Working Group
  - (formerly CFAR ECHPP Working Group)



#### **ECHPP-1 and ECHPP-2 Supplements**

- ECHPP-1 (2011): CFARs in nine highest AIDS prevalence cities supported to collaborate with local DOHs to conduct research on HIV prevention and care interventions in support of CDC ECHPP initiative
- ECHPP-2 (2012): Nine CFARs supported to conduct research with DOHs targeted at the HIV continuum of care testing, linkage, retention, adherence

- Hosted by DC D-CFAR at GWU on November 19-20, 2012

  - To expand the Working Group to all CFARs and APCs




