

LATINO OUTREACH SUCCESSES

 Improved testing rates from ~ 40% in 2008 to ~60% 2010

90% linkage, 78% virologic suppression

LATINO OUTREACH CHALLENGES

- Low uptake from high risk groups (e.g. MSM, MSMW)
- Low perceived risk and knowledge
 - 70% of men report transactional sex but low risk perception
 - 40% do not know HIV can be asymptomatic (3 X less likely to test)
- Fear of death and fear of discrimination/social isolation

SPECIFIC AIMS

Aim 1. To develop video and SMS messages that will deliver individualized information to urban, foreignborn Latino males related to HIV testing and healthcare utilization.

Aim 2. To evaluate the adequacy and acceptability of video and SMS messages to promote HIV testing.





LaMOCHA Intervention

A. Information

HIV education; HIV Service Provision; Socio-political ramifications

B. Motivation

Risk Perception; Social support; Working hours; Transport, Stay healthy to work

C. Behavior

HIV risk behavior; Health Care Engagement; Functioning Skills

HIV outcomes

Self-initiated HIV testing (timely HIV diagnosis)
